Are you ready for a fight?

A boodle fight is a large feast that is shared with family and close friends without formalities. It is one Filipino tradition that offers a selection of local dishes served in one whole table spread over large banana leaves. Filipinos just love to eat. Around it on the sides, a selection of local delicacies like grilled seafoods, meats, fruits, and vegetable slices are laid out. Feature: Learn More About the SEA Program!

What is the "SEA Program"?

"SEA Program" stands for "Study English Abroad Program" and is a study abroad program open to students from any faculty or department of Ehime University.

Participants in this program can earn 2 credits as a developmental course.

What universities are available?

Students can study at Bangor University in the UK, Dublin City University in Ireland, and the University of Alberta in Canada.

How long are the programs?

We offer short-term study abroad programs lasting approximately one month and medium-term programs lasting three months or longer.

Can I request a homestay?

Yes. All three partner universities offer homestays during the program.

When is the deadline to apply?

Deadlines vary depending on the program. Applications close as early as four months before departure, so we recommend that you start gathering information as early as possible.
